Identifying Keywords, Concepts, Synonyms and Related Terms

Effective researchers use a strategy of broadening their search for information by identifying keywords, concepts, synonyms, and related terms. You can find these alternative search terms by consulting an **overview article** in a magazine or encyclopedia, a **thesaurus**, a **dictionary**, **search engines**, and **subject headings** in the library catalog. You should start this process as soon as you decide on a topic or research question and continue to build your list throughout your inquiry.

Ex: earth temperature, greenhouse effect | Related Terms (Words that are closely associated with keywords, but not substitutes like synonyms) Ex: climate change, earth's atmosphere |
