(Citation Maker accounts for the fact that blogs and other online platforms that publish articles continuously should follow the citation format of a periodical article.)

Commenter's Last Name, First Initial. Middle Initial or Username. (Blog comment date). Title of blog comment or up to first 20 words of comment exactly as written [Comment on the blog post “Blog post title”]. *Blog Name*. URL

(Since the commenter did not indicate his or her full or real name, only their username is listed in the Author field.)
